

# MCHA Receives DCED Grant

The Monroe County Historical Association is very pleased to receive a grant totaling \$5,000 through the Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Community Revitalization Program. This grant funding was made possible through State Representative John Siptroth's office.

The money was needed to repair the old slate roof and chimney on the Stroud Mansion. The slate shingles had become deteriorated, and water from rain and snow had leaked into the building. Fortunately, none of the Association's collections were damaged. The shingles were replaced, and the ridge cap was re-coated and capped. The two chimneys also needed attention so new flashing and caps were installed.

Thank you to State Representative Siptroth and the members of his staff for working to ensure the Stroud Mansion and all of Monroe County's history continues to be protected.

# Dear Stroud Mansion,

In addition to working on organizing the educational traveling trunks and holding teacher workshops, members of the Committee also offered tours to hundreds of school children. A growing group of volunteers has made it possible to design tours and programs to address the needs of our schools. Our volunteers have researched the particular curricular requests of teachers, dressed in Colonial costume, warmly welcomed students and encouraged their active participation in their visit to the Mansion.

This year, in addition to the tour, the Education Committee created a hands-on activity for the students. Mystery bags containing dough scrappers led students to recognize the importance of the role of the blacksmith in the Colonial community.

Students were given fraktur cards to initial on their return to school. Their teachers received gift bags with a packet of note cards, a MCHA membership form, and information on MCHA's spring Student Fraktur Competition.


Dear Stroud Mansion,
