"Cullen Yates, 99 Years at Shawnee" special exhibit and art auction to benefit MCHA

The Monroe County Historical Association, in cooperation with the Shawnee Inn and Golf Resort, is pleased to announce an art and auction fundraiser of the work of Cullen Yates (1866-1945), a noted American Impressionist. The exhibit is titled, "Cullen Yates, 99 Years at Shawnee" and will be held Saturday, November 6 through Sunday, November 14, 2010 at the Shawnee Inn and Golf Resort in the Payette Room, 1 River Road, Shawnee-on-Delaware, PA 18356.

Cullen Yates achieved national prominence as a landscape painter during his lifetime. A native of Bryan, OH, Yates studied in New York and Paris before moving to Shawnee in 1908. The November Exhibit will feature regional and floral scenes as well as seascapes, all from local collections. Over thirty of the works of art will be available for purchase.

An auction of fifteen of Cullen Yates' works will be held on Saturday, November 13, 2010 at 3:00 p.m. in the Payette Room at Shawnee Inn and Golf Resort, PA.

Other events are scheduled in conjunction with the exhibit. An Opening Reception will be held on Saturday, November 6, 5:00 - 9:00 p.m. The cost is \$15.00 per person. A "Tea and Yates" light luncheon and program will be held on Sunday, November 7, 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. The cost is \$35.00 per person. The cost for individuals interested in



attending the Opening Reception and the "Tea and Yates" luncheon and program, and unlimited exhibit access is \$45.00 per person.

For the holiday edition of *The Fanlight*, I wanted to examine a unique collection that is housed at the Stroud Mansion: the Robacker Christmas cards. Earl and Ada Robacker were a prominent Monroe County couple with a love for their Pennsylvania German heritage. They collected and were experts on everything Pennsylvania Dutch from Fraktur and samplers to cookie cutters and quilts (and everything in between!) The Robackers wrote six books on Pennsylvania

German culture, antiques, lifestyles, and much more.

They incorporated their affinity for Pennsylvania folklore into many aspects of their lives, including their annual unique Christmas cards that they created. The cards always featured a clever rhyme or jingle and were illustrated with various Pennsylvania German motifs such as flowers, parakeets, and hearts.

The Robackers' Christmas cards will be on display in the second floor dining room of the Stroud Mansion throughout December. The cards brought holiday cheer to all who received them and will continue to do so this Christmas season.

Musings from the Mansion

Reporter in Residence, Monroe Mouse



While in the gift shop perusing some local Civil War journals, I overheard a conversation of a couple who had visited the Mansion for a tour. Here we are in October, and can you believe that they were talking about Christmas? The selection of paper doll coutom books had caught their attention. They didn't have to convince each other that these books would be perfect Christmas gifts for their grand-daughters.

This conversation had me reminiscing about Christmases past. The association of Christmas gifts with children did not exist in the English colonies in North America. In fact Christmas did not become the celebration as we know it today until the mid-eighteen hundreds, especially where children were concerned. It was more a celebration for adults with special meals, the singing of carols, and homes decorated with greens. In the homes of the wealthy, guests were entertained at a Christmas ball.

The Strouds, as Quakers, probably did not celebrate Christmas while adhering to the principle that one day is no more holy than another, as all days are the gift of the most *High*. Quakers were admonished not join in any public fasts, feasts, so-called "holy-days" or religious festivals.

Children today can thank German immigrants for Christmas celebrations that centered on the family and home. In Monroe County, the Pennsylvania Germans introduced the Christmas tree. By the 1820s, the tree in the home at Christmas was becoming more common. Children may have threaded dried apples to hang on the tree. After the holiday season, the apples were eaten as a winter treat. A Putz, complete with hand-carved figures, had a prominent

place in churches and later in the home during the Christmas It was a season. to make way children appreciate the Christmas story. The whole family could look forward to hand-made gifts and tasty cookies. In this season of giving, settlers made sure their neighbors had food and gifts for Christmas.



Today's Santa evolved over many years. The German tradition of Beltznicke (Belsnickel) was a figure to be feared, wearing a hat, wig, and long, heavy coat. In addition to his bag of goodies, he could also carry a switch to "punish" naughty children. Anticipating the Advent season, children dreamt of gifts of nuts, candies, and fruits from Beltznickel who arrived ringing sleigh bells. Parents may have noted a marked improvement in their children's behavior at this time of year.

All this reminiscing about Christmases past makes me think that I should be selecting gifts from the MCHA gift shop for my young friends.

It never fails. When I am looking through the old newspapers on microfilm in the archives of the Stroud Mansion library, I always get sidetracked. It is not that I can't stay focused or that I don't like to research (quite the opposite is true), it's just that I cannot help but read some of the interesting articles or smile at the cost of products and goods advertised by local businesses from years past.

One afternoon, I stumbled across the December 12, 1929 edition of The Morning Press from East Stroudsburg. Almost the entire edition was dedicated to publishing letters to Santa Claus from area children. The letters made me smile, and I wanted to share a few of them with you. They are transcribed exactly as they appeared.

Please bring me an electric train, bicycle, erector set, and anything else you have to spare.

Dear Santa:

I am a little girl about six years old. Please bring me a little umbrella, a nice warm coat to wear to school, a ring to give my sweetheart so he will be good to me when we are out playing games, a pair of bedroom slippers and a box of candy and that is all I can think of right now. But I do want a little wagon to haul groceries in for mother.

Your True Friend, Little Atchie

Dear Santa Claus,

I am a very good boy. I want a pair of dumbbells, a punching bag and an electric horse so I can get a trigger like Coolidge, four roast turkeys, a gallon of lemon ice cream soda, six pounds of turnips, and all of the other food you can spare.

Your little boy, Herbie. P.S. - Also send me a set of books on physical culture.

Dear Santa Claus, I am a little girl of eight years old. My name is Ethel Bell. I am going to tell you in the letter what I want for Christmas. I want a nice blue coat with fur on it, a blue dress and a pair of black shoes. I think that all. But please don't forget to bring me some candy and nuts. Don't forget to bring my mother and father some candy and nuts. I will close with lot of kisses. Happy Christmas. From, Ethel

My Dear Friend Santa,

I am a little girl ten years old. I would like you to bring me a Guitar and a pair of skies, and whatever else you think would be nice for me. Don't forget to bring us a nice Christmas tree like last year's tree. Your Friend, Winifred. P.S. Don't forget Mother and Father.

I am a little girl six years old. I wish you would bring me a writing desk, a big doll, pencil box, a large ironing board, and lots of nuts, candy, oranges, and other fruit.

> Bring my dog a collar. I call him Lindy. Don't forget my síster Bobíe, she wants a níce large pocket book. My brother Harry wants a wrist watch.

Please don't forget my big brother-in-law Davie, bring him lots of gas and oil he has an Essex car.

I am a good little boy and I live way up here in the mountains. I cannot see any way for me to talk with you so I am writing you a short letter. I want a nice little toy engine, a pony and some nice little dolls to play with. Don't forget my mother.
